OVERNIGHT LANE CLOSURES SCHEDULED FOR I-64 WIDENING PROJECT *Monday, October 17 – Thursday, October 20*

NEWPORT NEWS —Starting Monday, October 17, through Thursday, October 20, east- and westbound single-lane closures are scheduled on Fort Eustis Boulevard between the Interstate 64 on- and off-ramps, from 8 p.m. until 5 a.m. the following morning. One travel lane in each direction will remain open to traffic at all times. All construction work is dependent upon weather conditions.

Westbound truck traffic on Interstate 64 is now restricted to the right lane between Jefferson Avenue (exit 255) and Yorktown Road (exit 247). Motorists are also advised to be alert to the reduced 55 mph work zone speed limit in this area, which will remain in effect throughout construction.

To minimize inconvenience to motorists, no daytime lane closures are planned at this time. Lane closures and construction information will be announced weekly. About the I-64 Widening Project: The project consists of two operationally independent segments to increase I-64 travel capacity on the Peninsula by adding a travel lane and shoulder lane in each direction between Jefferson Avenue (exit 255) and Yorktown Road (exit 247) for Segment I and from Yorktown Road (exit 247) to Route 199 (Humelsine Parkway/Marquis Center Parkway) near exit 242 for Segment II. Plans are to ultimately widen the interstate to the Route 199 interchange near Lightfoot in York County.
