Come see the proposed plans to provide safety improvements to the Route 460/29 corridor from Route 501 (Campbell Avenue) to Route 29 (Monacan Parkway) through the use of access management, including the removal of crossovers, closure of the Tyreeanna Road intersection and accommodations for turning movements at Concord Turnpike involving construction of a jughandle.

Review the proposed project plans and the environmental documentation in the form of a Programmatic Categorical Exclusion at the public hearing or at VDOT's Lynchburg District Office located at 4219 Campbell Avenue in Lynchburg, 434-947-6559 or TTY/TDD 711.
