### **Proposed Limited Access Control Change Route 17 (Mills Drive) at Route 17 Business/Route 2 (Tidewater Trail) Spotsylvania County**

#### **Willingness for Public Comment**

The Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) is accepting comments regarding a proposed limited access control change along Route 17 (Mills Drive) in the New Post area of Spotsylvania County.

The proposed change is an approximate 60-foot break in the limited access boundary along the north side of Route 17, approximately 350 feet west of the Route 17 Business and Route 17/ Route 2 signalized intersection.

The requested break in the limited access boundary is in connection with the proposed development of a commercially zoned parcel located in the northwest quadrant of the subject intersection.

The change will create a break in the limited access boundary on Route 17 for a new entrance that will provide access to and from a proposed 7-Eleven convenience store and gas station development by way of a right-in/right-out (RI/RO) only commercial entrance.
